

# **West Sussex Picture Book Awards**









Over the course of the week commencing January 31st, Year 3 and 4 took part in the annual West Sussex Picture Book Awards. Throughout the week, learners were introduced to four brand new picture books, enthusiastically delivered by Mrs Taylor, Mrs Durand, Mrs Hilton and Ms Williams. As well as having the books presented, learners engaged in discussions about their favourite picture books and what makes these so utterly unforgettable. The four books presented were called *Hom*, *Pip & Egg*, *The Invisible* and *The Big Freeze* and three of the four authors virtually visited our school to talk in greater detail about their stories, take questions and lead exciting illustration-based activities. At the end of the week, the children voted for their favourite and the Windmills' vote crowned the adorable *Hom* as the winner, although it was far from a walkover.

Hom obtained 54 votes, The Big Freeze 41, Pig & Egg, 32 and finally The Invisible with a very respectable 27.

Whether the rest of the schools in West Sussex agree with our vote remains to be seen and the full result will be revealed on World Book Day, Thursday 3rd March 2022.








# **Book Week and World Book Day 2022**


## **The Masked Reader**
