
# What happened during Book Week?

Frank Cottrell Boyce shared excerpts from his new book, spoke to the children about becoming a writer and did a Q&A.


**Lisa Thompson** shared her love for reading and talked about her new book. The children even enjoyed a virtual escape room!














**Dr Sheila Kanani, Henry Paker** and **Lucy Hawking** did a virtual event for a Story Makers non-fiction special.

Lots of staff got involved in the spirit of book week and having fun by reading a book in disguise. The children had fun working out who was who—some used technology and some used costumes—great job everyone!






#### Writing Competition Launch—Twister Fairy Tales

<u>What?</u> We are challenging the children to write their very own twisted fairy tale. (just like the authors on this page). This could be a twist on a traditional tale or their very own, original one. They can present their writing in any format they wish (e.g. comic, poem, traditional story). They could think about:

- Changing the setting or part of the plot or adding a new character
- Changing the personalities or gender of your characters
- Writing the tale from the another character's view point
- Changing the problem or finding a different solution
- Adding a little humour or horror
- Writing a different ending
